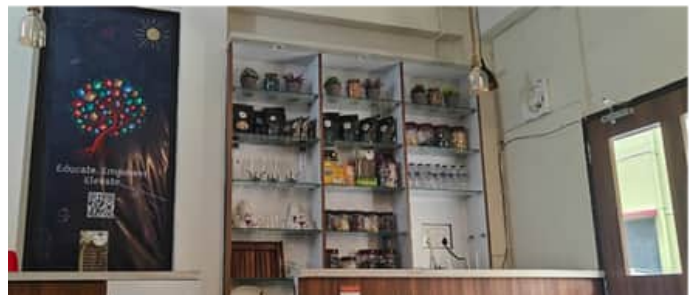


MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The number of children under comprehensive mentorship has reached **129**. 2024 marked a year of further expansion in the form of members, mentors, volunteers and change agents enrolling with MCF. Total numbers reached – Mentors: **37**, Members: **78**, Registered Donors: **230**, Volunteers – **21** and Change Agents – **14**.

ADOPTION OF LEARNING CENTERS

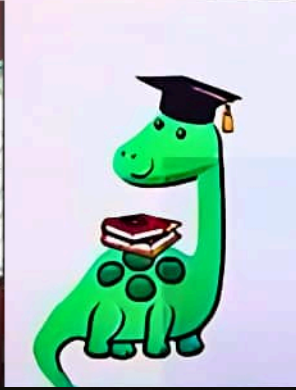

Annual Meet



The annual meet for 2023 was organized on 18th June at Rabindra Tirtha, Newtown and it was a grand success. Our Chief Guest was honorable, Mr. Debashis Sen, Managing Director – HIDCO. On the very day of our annual meet, we launched the MCF Mascot – Brackie, which is a representation of our values and the work we do.

Mentorship Program

The number of children under comprehensive mentorship has reached **120**.

Total numbers reached- **26** mentors, **53** members, **207** donors, **16** volunteers, and **12** change agents.

Clothing Drive

Collected **5,000+** clothes and distributed them to children in Sundarban homes.

Mentorship Program: 60 children under comprehensive mentorship.

Engagement: 24 mentors, 47 members, 165 donors, 11 volunteers, and 6 change agents.

Learning Centers: Launched coaching centers in remote villages of Bengal. First Learning Center: Kulti, Asansol – 29th Sept 2022 (18 children). Other Centers: Arbetal, Goalberia, Rangapara (16-20 children each).

Annual Meet: A successful event held on 1st May, featuring cultural programs, talent hunt, and clothes distribution. Fundraising Event: 5th Nov 2022 – Cultural fundraiser with renowned artists to support the foundation.

Fight Covid-19 Together

We established a 125-bedded safe home at Ramakrishna Mission Narendrapur with government collaboration. Also we provided support to Affected Families Helped 100 children impacted by COVID-19, especially from daily-wage families.



Mentorship Program

30 children were supported under this mentorship program, receiving guidance and resources to help them achieve their academic goals.

Engagement

We're grateful for the collective effort of our community including **5** mentors, **23** members, **104** donors and **3** volunteers. Together, they're empowered by **1** visionary change agent.

A few words from one of ours.....

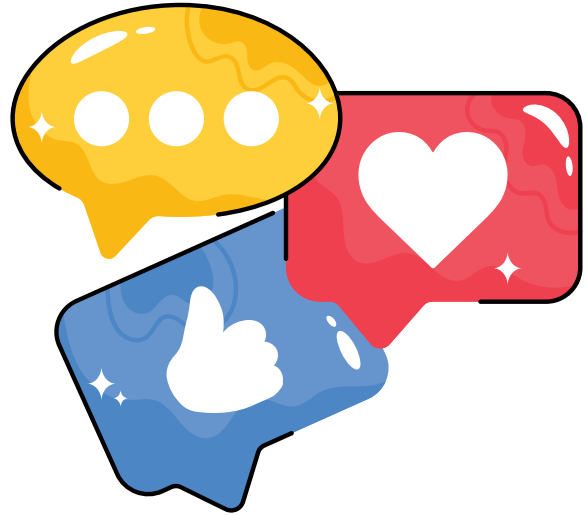


Sikha Roy
